CAREER START FUNDING

ELIGIBILITY FOR FUNDING:

Funding is available for this qualification if:

- The student is assessed as a disadvantaged learner (faces barriers to training participation and requires additional support prior to enrolment in a certificate III vocational qualification)
- It is approved for delivery as part of a project funded under Skilling Queenslanders for Work (SQW)
- Are aged 15 years or older and not enrolled in school
- · Permanently reside in Queensland
- Are an Australian or New Zealand citizen, permanent resident, or eligible visa holder
- Have not completed a Certificate III or higher qualification in the past 10 years*
- Are not currently enrolled in another qualification
- Meet any additional entry requirements listed in the Queensland Subsidised Training List

*Exemptions apply for school qualifications and foundation skills courses.

PAYMENTS

A contribution to the cost of training and assessment services - called a co-contribution fee - must be made by students undertaking a certificate III level vocational qualification and non-concessional students undertaking certificate I and/or II level vocational qualifications. Coal Train will charge a fee per student to be paid by the student or community group. This fee includes all costs for the training. Invoicing will incur at the completion of the intake.

Concessional: \$100.00
