CAREER START - GENERAL TRAINING

Under Career Start program, an individual may access up to two subsidised training places through one of the following options:

- a general qualification at certificate III and an apprenticeship/traineeship, noting that if the apprenticeship/ traineeship is done first, the individual is no longer eligible to access a general qualification under Career Start; or
- · two apprenticeships/traineeships at either certificate II or III, including school based apprenticeships or traineeships (SATs).

In addition, under Career Start, individuals may access one subsidised introductory-level skill set.

You may be eligible for a funded Career Start training place if you:

- Are aged 15 years or older and not enrolled in school
- · Permanently reside in Queensland
- Are an Australian or New Zealand citizen, permanent resident, or eligible visa holder
- Have not completed a Certificate III or higher qualification in the past 10 years*
- Are not currently enrolled in another qualification
- Meet any additional entry requirements listed in the Queensland Subsidised Training List
- * Exemptions apply for school qualifications and foundation skills courses.

PAYMENTS

A contribution to the cost of training and assessment services - called a co-contribution fee - must be made by students undertaking a certificate III level vocational qualification and non-concessional students undertaking certificate I and/or II level vocational qualifications. Coal Train will charge a fee per student to be paid by the student or community group. This fee includes all costs for the training.

Co-contribution fees (per person):

Non-Concessional: \$250.00

Concessional: \$150.00

* The above rate is based on training in Yeppoon.

FEE FOR SERVICE

For fee for service attendees the cost of the qualification is \$3,000. This option is for those who do not qualify for the Career Start Funding.
